

TRAINING IN INTEGRATIVE SUPERVISION

Supervision is the practice of professional reflection, review and evaluation of work in the human relations field. This course will be of interest to psychotherapists, counsellors, psychologists and related professionals, who are accredited by their professional organisation for a minimum of 4 years, are currently offering supervision, and have undertaken an initial supervision training.

The course aims to equip participants with the knowledge, skills and personal awareness to work effectively as a supervisor.

This training can be taken as Part II of the Institute's supervision training, or as a stand alone CPD for current supervisors, and fulfils the training requirements for supervisor accreditation with I.A.H.I.P. and I.A.C.P.

This course will also be valuable as a refresher course for supervisors wanting Continuing Professional Development.

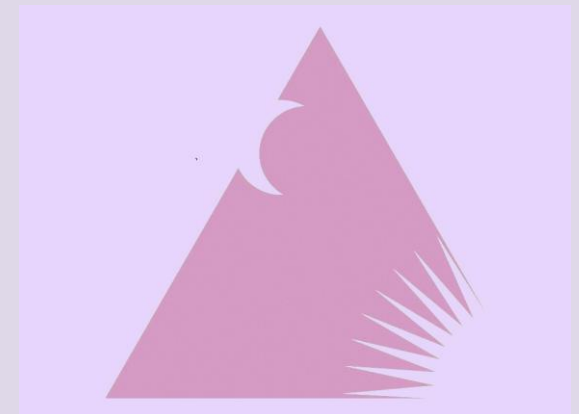

CONTENT

This course will offer participants:

1. A setting in which to engage in and receive feedback on supervision practice.
2. Group supervision of supervisory work.
3. Process group exploring issues related to the supervisory role.
4. Seminars to explore key themes in clinical supervision

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Participants will have developed a level of competence in practising supervision autonomously.

This involves:

- Adequate self awareness in the role
- Fluid level of skilful presence
- Adequate familiarity with key theoretical themes

There will be an assessment process to evaluate these competencies.
